Commissioner asked if the settlements and conciliated numbers we have are high. It looks like the highest number we have had.

Director Quintana stated it is not the highest we have had. She feels it is rising, because in the previous year pandemic it did affect how many cases we mediated due to people not wanting to meet in person. Prior to last year we would have \$1,040 to \$1,050 in settlements. Compared to last contract this is a big improvement.

NEW BUSINESS:

• Fair Housing Event 2021 – Reviewed

This event is usually done in April. Due to the pandemic, we pushed it back and will be hosting on October 13th at the Memorial Coliseum. We are partnered with Community Development: Office of Housing and Neighborhood Services. They help us on the financial aspect. We will have keynote speaker, Aaron, he's with fair housing in New York. We will also have six breakout sessions that vary from Amy Nelson to Stephen Dane.

• Welcoming Week

Assisting with Diversity Awards and Cultural Awareness Training. Very similar to what we did last year, we will be working alongside with YMCA. Commissioner Ervin is assisting in the training, along with Director Quintana and Francisco Townsend. In the past there have been nine awards, this year we are trying to finalize what we want them to look like and whether we are going to give less or more awards. Commissioners will be kept in the loop because it may be something we want to sponsor. As we believe in supporting those type of awards, it is part of our mission when we think about the outreach and education.
