• Updated Forms

Over the past couple of months, we have been working on updating the format of our intake forms, letters, notices, determination hearing logs, and determination hearing documents. There have also been changes to our Commission meeting office reports and agendas. Our goal is to create uniformity in all our standard documents and make them easier for the public to understand. These changes will also help to streamline our process.

• HUD Partnership and SEE Awards

Metro will be receiving \$15,000 in Partnership funds from HUD. These are usually used for outreach and education. Our goal is to use most of these of these funds for our 2024 Fair Housing Summit.

Metro will also be receiving \$12,000 in SEE funds (Special Enforcement Funds) and these funds can be used for litigation costs related to fair housing cases and tech.
